

English

In English the children will be learning through a range of high quality texts to:

- Sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and forming lower case and Capital letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the correct place.
- Name all letters of the alphabet in order.
- Use clear finger spaces between each word.
- Spell common words carefully.
- Understand that words can combine to make sentences.
- Say out loud and form sentences about what they are going to write.
- Structure and form a simple sentence with a full stop and capital letter.
- Speak audibly in front of small audiences.
- Recognise and join in with predictable phrases.
- Link what they read or hear to their own experiences.
- Discuss the significance of titles and events in books.

Phonics and Reading

In daily Phonics sessions the children will follow the systematic 'Letters and Sounds' phonics programme to develop their phonics skills and become fluent readers. They will practise reading aloud in daily Guided Reading sessions using an audible voice and ask and answer questions about a wide range of books.

Maths

In Maths the children will be learning to;

- Count up to 20 objects (match number to object)
- Estimate and count up to 30 objects
- Count on and back and order numbers to 10
- Recognise domino/dice arrays without counting
- Identify a number 1 more (next number in count)
- Find pairs that make 5; subitise to 5; find pairs that make 6; subitise to 6; find pairs that make 10; subitise fingers to 10
- Match pairs to 5, 6 and 10 to number sentences
- Find missing numbers in number sentences
- Double numbers 1 to 5; find 1 and 2 more
- Count back 1 and begin to find 1 less
- Recognise, name and describe squares, rectangles, circles and triangles
- Recognise basic line symmetry
- Sort 2D shapes according to their properties
- Read and write numbers and their names to 20
- Compare and order numbers to 20
- Identify 1 more and 1 less
- Estimate sets of objects
- Count to check and order sets according to size; understand 0 as the empty set

Science

In Science the children will be learning about 'ANIMALS INCLUDING HUMANS' in order to;

- Ask simple questions.
- Observe closely, using simple equipment.
- Identify and classify.
- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body.
- Say which part of the body is associated with each sense.



Computing

Children will be learning to:

ESAFETY FOCUS

- Use technology safely and respectfully.
- Use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs
- Identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content on the internet or other online technology.

Art & Design Technology

In Art the children will be learning to;

- Draw and paint to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination.
- Develop techniques in using colour, form and space, i.e. primary and secondary colours, thick and thin brushes.
- Describe what they can see and like in the work of a famous artist. (Andy Warhol).

In Design & Technology the children will 'design and make' using a range of materials, including food. They will talk about their ideas, discussing what they like and dislike.

Music

The Children will participate in weekly $\frac{1}{2}$ hour sessions focusing on 'Exploring sounds'.

PE

The children will be learning to;

- Be confident and safe in the spaces used to play games.
- Explore and use skills, actions and ideas individually and in combination.
- Recognise and describe how their bodies feel during different activities.
- Listen to and follow instructions.
