Dear Parents/Carers,

Year One – Wonderful Wednesday's

Our first 'Wonderful Wednesday' session will be at 9:10am on Wednesday 22th September 2021. This is a time for you to meet the adults in your child's class and see their new learning environment.

Every Wednesday, you are invited to visit your child's classroom from 9.10am until 9.30am. You will be able to join in with a range of activities, planned by the class teacher. You are not **expected** to attend these sessions, they are not compulsory, but all of you are very welcome. You do not need to let us know in advance, just turn up on the days you wish to attend. If you are not able to attend, a family member may come in your place. Please ensure that only one family member attends each week, due to space restrictions.

Your children will be collected from the playground, by their class teacher, as usual on this day. Once they have been collected by their teacher, you can make your way to the classrooms, where you will be asked to 'sign in' via a class list at the classroom door. **It is important that your child's morning routine of lining up with their classmates continues.** Therefore, please ensure that you arrive promptly on these days as you do every day. If you do not have childcare for a younger sibling, please ensure that they are kept with you at all times. Buggies may be left in the rainbow room.

Please help us by leaving the classroom area promptly at 9.30am, on the teacher's signal, as the children will need to be registered at this time.

This is **not** a time to talk to the teacher about your child's progress or to look through their workbooks. Our termly consultation evenings are for you to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher and the scheduled 'open classroom' sessions are for you to view your child's work. These '**Wonderful Wednesday**' sessions, are for you to **engage in activities** with your child.

We hope to see many of you on the morning of our first Wonderful Wednesday session.
